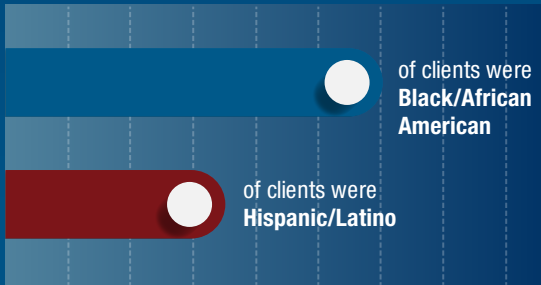

reached viral suppression*

in 2023 compared with 69.5% in 2010, which means they cannot sexually transmit HIV to their partners** and can live longer and healthier lives.

An increase of 3.1 percentage points



in viral suppression occurred from 2020 to 2023 among youth clients aged 24 and younger.

* Viral suppression is based on data for people with HIV who had at least one outpatient ambulatory health services visit and at least one viral load test during the measurement year and whose most recent viral load test result was less than 200 copies/mL.

** Known as "U=U" for "Undetectable = Untransmittable."
